Additionally, panel discussions are encouraged as a submission, in lieu of a formal presentation, particularly if the panel offers the opportunity to highlight differing approaches to a problem or situation.

Selections

Presentations from ERAPPA member institutions and business partners are welcomed. Business partner presentations are expected to have an institutional member as co-presenter. In fact, joint presentations that showcase effective partnerships between business partners and institutions are encouraged. Presentations must be non-proprietary in nature and cannot advertise a product or service. The Professional Development committee will review the submissions for:

- 1. Relevance to the conference theme
- 2. Timeliness and interest of the topic to facilities professionals
- 3. Innovative ideas
- 4. Qualification(s) of the presenter(s)
- 5. Strong involvement of an institution on the presentation team

The Committee may apply a preference for presentations that highlight an institution that is local or regional to the conference location.

Presentation Requirements

1. Educational sessions are 60 minutes in length, including time for questions.

- 2. Presentations will be placed on standard ERAPPA PowerPoint templates.
- 3. Presentations will be required to be submitted for review and approval prior to the conference.
- 4. Presenters are expected to register for the conference.

Learning Units and Professional Development Credits

Although attendees typically seek topics of interest to them personally or to their employer, they may also be seeking presentations that provide them with continuing education credits (i.e., AIA and CEU credits) in a variety of disciplines. If a presentations can or may provide credits in any category, it should be identified as such in the submission, by marking the appropriate check boxes. The ERAPPA Professional Development Committee will also work with presenters who feel their presentations may be applicable for credits and submit it for educational credits. ERAPPA is a registered AIA/CES provider.
